Through God's people we find that his purpose is being lived out in their lives of worship, service and devotion, inside and outside of the church. 
Sermons in September and October

Eugene Peterson writes in the introduction to the book of Jeremiah in The Message Bible that, "Jeremiah's life and Jeremiah's book are a single piece. He wrote what he lived, he lived what he wrote. There is no separation between his life and his book." Adding to Peterson's comments, I would say that Jeremiah speaks his mind—a somewhat disturbed and distressed mind at times. More than any other prophet he complains to God about the job assigned to him. I think that makes the Sunday after Labor Day a perfect time to begin a sermon series from Jeremiah. Preschool (ages 3 and 4) - Lari Skowron will introduce our youngest learners to the love of God each Sunday morning. In the middle room of the primary department - right at the bottom of the steps.

K – 1 - Teachers Renee Trunick and Susan Chimera provide a loving environment for children to meet God as they begin a new series of lessons from The Gospel Project. On the lower level – right at the bottom of the steps.
