Welcome to Ken Mawr United Presbyterian Church in the name of Christ Jesus our great high priest! The first "priest of God most high" was Melchizedek. Melchizedek, whose name means "king of righteousness," was a king of Salem (Jerusalem) and priest of the most high God whose sudden appearance and disappearance in the book of Genesis is somewhat mysterious. Yet, God has chosen Jesus to fill the space as Mediator between God and humanity. Jewish high priests were human beings "subject to weakness," as verse 2 talks about them, and equipped to understand human creatures. Scripture Hebrews 5:1-10

1 Every high priest is selected from among the people and is appointed to represent the people in matters related to God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. 2 He is able to deal gently with those who are ignorant and are going astray, since he himself is subject to weakness. 3 This is why he has to offer sacrifices for his own sins, as well as for the sins of the people. 4 And no one takes this honor on himself, but he receives it when called by God, just as Aaron was. 5 In the same way, Christ did not take on himself the glory of becoming a high priest.
