We welcome first-time visitors and lifelong friends to Ken Mawr United Presbyterian Church! The book of Hebrews says we must think of God in Jesus Christ, God as he existed in time and space. He felt and he feels with us. He suffered and he suffers with us, whether it's the misery of sorrow or the prick of fear or the nausea of sickness or the agony of temptation. That's the miracle of the Incarnation, the miracle of a great high priest who is Jesus the Son of God. Our Scripture today is mostly about Jesus' qualifications to be our Mediator. To do the work of atonement, he must be a great and merciful high priest, both Son of God and "tempted in every way, just as we are," (v. 15) so that he can stand in our place and empathetically walk with us in our weakness. Just any random person could not save us from certain death.
