Welcome!

A warm welcome to Ken Mawr Church! The people in the biblical story of the flood have gotten to the point where *“The LORD saw how great the wickedness of the human race had become on the earth, and that every inclination of the thoughts of the human heart was only evil all the time”* (v. 5). There is nothing to redeem these wretched human beings. The Noah story of popular culture isn’t the real story. The real story is an Apocalypse. The real story has the Lord wiping from the face of the earth the human race he created. The real story has a drunken Noah, which I intentionally left out of today’s reading, because the real story is not a fitting story for children, unless you want to give them nightmares. Last week, when we considered Cain and his situation, we were reminded that God loved Cain, and that love really messes with justice. So even though Cain deserved death, God preserved his life. Old Testament scholar Walter Brueggemann suggests that this tension between judgment and mercy in the heart of God is also the key to understanding the Apocalyptic story of the flood. *-Pastor Karl*

Scripture

Genesis 6:5-8; 8:15-22

5 The LORD saw how great the wickedness of the human race had become on the earth, and that every inclination of the thoughts of the human heart was only evil all

the time. 6 The LORD regretted that he had made human beings on the earth, and his heart was deeply troubled. 7 So the LORD said, "I will wipe from the face of the earth the human race I have created—and with them the animals, the birds and the creatures that move along the ground—for I regret that I have made them." 8 But Noah found favor in the eyes of the LORD.

15 Then God said to Noah, 16 "Come out of the ark, you and your wife and your sons and their wives. 17 Bring out every kind of living creature that is with you—the birds, the animals, and all the creatures that move along the ground—so they can multiply on the earth and be fruitful and increase in number on it." 18 So Noah came out, together with his sons and his wife and his sons' wives. 19 All the animals and all the creatures that move along the ground and all the birds—everything that moves on land—came out of the ark, one kind after another. 20 Then Noah built an altar to the LORD and, taking some of all the clean animals and clean birds, he sacrificed burnt offerings on it. 21 The LORD smelled the pleasing aroma and said in his heart: "Never again will I curse the ground because of humans, even though every inclination of the human heart is evil from childhood. And never again will I destroy all living creatures, as I have done. 22 "As long as the earth endures, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night will never cease." (NIV)

Sermon

"Apocalypse"

*Affirmation of Faith in Action—from Hebrews 11:1-7

Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see.

This is what the ancients were commended for.

By faith we understand that the universe was formed at God's command, so that what is seen was not made out of what was visible.

By faith Abel brought God a better offering than Cain did. By faith he was commended as righteous, when God spoke well of his offerings. And by faith Abel still speaks, even though he is dead.

By faith Enoch was taken from this life, so that he did not experience death: "He could not be found, because God had taken him away." For before he was taken, he was commended as one who pleased God.

And without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to him must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who earnestly seek him.

By faith Noah, when warned about things not yet seen, in holy fear built an ark to save his family. By his faith he condemned the world and became heir of the righteousness that is in keeping with faith.

The Mizpah Benediction

Genesis 31:49 is commonly called the Mizpah Benediction. In Hebrew, Mizpah translates to "watchtower" or "lookout". It originates from the Biblical story from Genesis 31 where Jacob and Laban use a pile of stones to mark an agreement. Laban declares: *"The Lord watch between you and me when we are absent one from another."* Because of this, it is commonly used today as a token of deep emotional bond, protection, and remembrance between loved ones separated by distance.
