# SUMMER SERIES - GENESIS

## “Great Stories from Genesis” Summer Sermon Series 2026

Children are often fascinated with stories of their birth and babyhood. Families trace genealogies. Nations write histories. When we know more about how things began, the pressures of the present and our hopes for the future take on new meaning. Genesis is a book of beginnings, about the origin of the universe, the birth of the human race, the founding of the Hebrew nation.

In the book of Genesis, we read some truly great stories about God, about humanity, and about their relationship to each other. Even so, the stories we read in Genesis are difficult for our 21st century minds to process. Yet we want to read them because we can learn about the character of God by observing his behavior in relationship with his people. And if we're totally honest, we often struggle with what we read and see.

I said in a recent sermon that we've made God too tame, too familiar. We have tended to create God in our own image, as “the man upstairs, the good guy, or the good Lord.” In Genesis we see what these challenging stories reveal to us about the Creator of the universe who is much more than a “good guy.” The God of the Bible is complex. Never simple. Never manageable. He is a God to be reckoned with, taken seriously, trusted, and worshiped.

I invite you to join us in worship this summer as we delve into the great stories of individuals, families, tribes, and nations. I suspect you will find that some of their experiences mirror your own, which will provide a way for each one of us to consider how God can lead us into new ways of knowing and serving him.

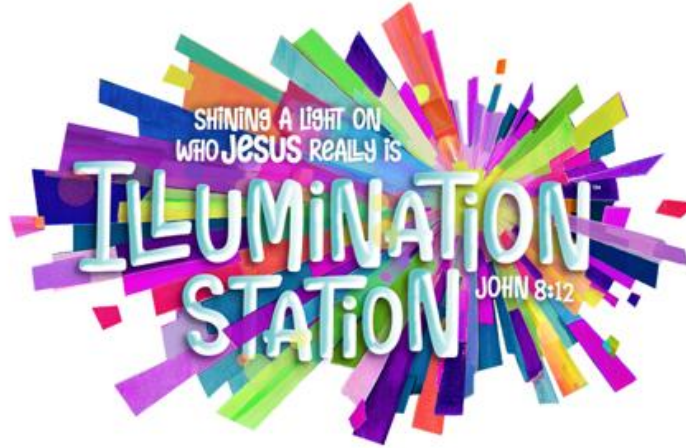
